Registration for Maymester begins at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, April 23rd. You can register:

- 3) Come to the Pepper Computer Lab in room 263 at 636 West Call Street, Pepper Center, FSU Campus. Volunteers will be available to assist you on 4/23, 4/24, 4/25 between 10:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. - park in the circle drive - free for 15 minutes!

To register online you must sign in with your username and password. We suggest that you sign in before the 23rd in case you have misplaced or forgotten your password or username and can request a new one. If you do not have an account you must create one before you can purchase a course and/or membership. If you were not an OLLI member in the spring, the online registration system will require you to purchase a 2012 Maymester membership (\$20) before purchasing a class.
