FSU's scholarly endeavors are now accessible around the globe through the revolutionary website **Grad-World FSU**. Similar to Google Earth, *GradWorld FSU* displays a variety of personalized videos from a number of departments and colleges on campus for the purpose of showcasing graduate student achievements and their tremendous contributions to the university and the world at large.

The database is sortable by country of origin, language, college, degree program and degree level. To increase the website's global reach, international participants are asked to record two

videos — one in English and one in their native tongue — with the hope of inspiring their countrymen and countrywomen to apply to Florida State.

2021 Celebration of Graduate Student Excellence

The Florida State University Graduate School held their annual Celebration of Graduate Student Excellence in 2021. This is always one of our favorite events. Unfortunately, this year we were not able to celebrate the excellence in our usual joyous face-to-face gathering for The Graduate School Celebration of Excellence at the Alumni Center. **We hope you enjoy the video we have created in its place.**

After a welcome from Dean Mark Riley (0:30), names and achievements of graduate students and postdoctoral scholars are introduced by faculty and staff from The Graduate School. Dr. Lisa Liseno recognizes the Program for Instructional Excellence Teaching Associates and Outstanding Teaching Assistant Award winners (1:13). Mr. Brian Barton announces the Preparing Future Faculty (8:11) and Preparing Future Professionals (9:27) Fellows, as well as winners of the Research & Creativity Awards (11:31), Three Minute Thesis Awards (12:10), Master's in 4 Awards (13:01), and Graduate Faculty Mentor Awards (14:18). Winners of the Graduate Student Leadership Award (10:16) and UROP Graduate Mentor Awards (13:44) are shared by Mr. James Beck. Dr. Adrienne Stephenson highlights the recipients of national & prestigious external fellowships and awards (18:19), while winners of various postdoctoral awards (20:17) are presented by Dr. Debi Fadool.

2020-2021 Research and Creativity Awards

The 2020-2021 Research and Creativity Award (RCA) winners represent the three broad disciplines: Arts & Humanities; Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics; and Social & Behavioral Sciences. Each nominee's materials were reviewed remotely by discipline-specific judging panels.

The Arts & Humanities winner is Joshua Matson, now a doctoral graduate from the Religions of Western Antiquity (RWA) track of the FSU Religion Department. Joshua's major professor, Dr. Matthew Goff, explained that Joshua's dissertation "addresses what the Dead Sea Scrolls contribute to our understanding of the development of the so-called Minor Prophets, a collection of twelve small books in the Bible attributed to prophets."





The *Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics* Research & Creativity Award Winner is **Pamela Knoll,** now a doctoral graduate in Chemistry and Biochemistry. Pamela's major professor, Dr. Oliver Steinbock, said, "Most of Pamela's work aims to elucidate the growth mechanism of polycrystalline aggregates (called 'biomorphs')."

The **Social & Behavioral Sciences** Research and Creativity Award winner is **Mary Duffy**, a Psychology doctoral student in Dr. Thomas Joiner's laboratory. Mary is conducting "... research on the role of body experiences in suicidal thoughts and behaviors".

2020 Three Minute Thesis Competition

The Three Minute Thesis (3MT[™]) is a research communication competition developed by The University of Queensland, Australia. Doctoral students have three minutes, using one static slide, to present a compelling presentation about their dissertation for a non-specialist audience. In Fall 2020, the competition was conducted virtually with the competitors creating, editing, and submitting three-minute videos that were viewed by 3MT Preliminary Round Judges.

A 3MT Zoom recording and editing workshop was led by Mr. Tom Cruz, Director of GEOSET, and the Graduate School. The recording of the 3MT workshop was made available on the Graduate School's website. Twenty-one doctoral students from sixteen academic programs competed in the Preliminary Round. The Preliminary Round Judges selected nine finalists who were allowed to edit their presentations prior to the 3MT Finals Competition. The 3MT Finals Judges were:

2021 Master's in Four (Min4) Competition



Florida State University held its third-annual Master's in Four (Min4) competition in Spring 2021. Master's students have four minutes to present four slides and provide a clear, simple explanation of their specialized research for a diverse audience. Judges assess the effectiveness of each presentation based on numerous criteria, such as the strength of the introduction, how evidence-based information is presented in an easily understandable format, and the overall quality of oral communication.

This year's competition was conducted virtually with the competitors' videos and embedded slides first viewed and ranked by Min4 Preliminary Round judges. Seven finalists were selected to compete in the final round of the Min4 competition. The Min4 finalist judges were Professor Debra Fadool, Dean of the Jim Moran College of Entrepreneurship Susan Fiorito, Interim Vice President for Research Laurel Fulkerson, Director of the Center for Global Engagement Cindy Green, Assistant Provost Stephen McDowell, Professor Patricia Warren Hightower and Professor Mark Zeigler.

3rd Annual Spring Conversation Series

DIRECTO held its 3rd Annual Spring Conversation Series monthly from February to May 2021. These conversations provide a "brave-space" for members of FSU and the surrounding community to discuss issues of diversity, inclusion, and equity. Presentations are designed in formats conducive to encouraging conversation and participation. Specific attention is given to how these concepts of diversity, equity, and inclusion relate to topics in teaching and research, as well as tangible ways to incorporate them into research projects and teaching methods. Below is a look at the variety of engaging topics discussed this year, and please remember to check the **DIRECTO website** for future series and events!

- College of Communication & Information (CCI) faculty, Drs. Michelle Kazmer, Dawn Betts-Green, Melissa Gross, Don Latham, Stephen McDowell, Jessica Wendorf Muhamad, and Professor Malia Bruker analyzed antiracism within course contexts.
- Jacob Garcia, a CCI undergraduate student, explored motivation, identity, and representation through a discussion about the lack of Black and Brown representation in media and subsequent imposter syndrome.
- **Dr. Adeola Fayemi**, Diversity and Inclusion Manager at Auburn University, presented about positioning acculturation strategies for transformational learning and academic success.
- Professional mediator Tye Bourdony (JD, CFR) discussed mediation skills and tackling bias by expanding inclusivity and reframing communication.
- College of Education faculty, Drs. Laura Reid Marks, Deborah Ebener, Deb Osborn, and Taylor Thompson examined organizational/program diversity statements and the process of integrating a statement's values into faculty and student culture.



Dr. Lisa Liseno Appointed to National Diversity and Inclusiveness Advisory Committee

Dr. Lisa Liseno, Assistant Dean of the Graduate School, has been appointed by the President of the **Council of Graduate Schools** (CGS) to its **Diversity and Inclusiveness Advisory Committee** (DIAC). CGS is the only national organization in the United States dedicated exclusively to the advancement of graduate education and research. DIAC serves the mission of advising CGS, its members, and

others wanting the CGS perspective on issues related to underrepresented and minority populations. DIAC is comprised of CGS members appointed for their work in diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI), and members meet regularly to discuss strategies to enhance DEI in graduate programs.

Fellows Society Spring 2021 Annual Fellows Forum

The Fellows Forum is an opportunity for members of the Fellows Society to put into action the interdisciplinary ideals of the Fellows Society by organizing a symposium that brings together scholars and professionals from a variety of viewpoints to address a problem of broad humanistic significance. Each spring members of the Fellows Society organize this annual event, including choosing a unique theme, and inviting speakers from a variety



of disciplines to engage in discussions on challenging and timely topics. The Fellows engagement in the planning and development of each Forum provides valuable professional development experience. Spring 2021's two-day Fellows Forum's theme was "Surviving & Thriving through Chaos: Resilience, Community, & Creativity in the Face of Crisis." Speakers from a variety of disciplines spoke on panels, graduate students provided poster presentations, and keynote addresses were given by Dr. Ebrahim Ahmadisharaf from FSU's Civil and Environmental Engineering, and Dr. Antonio C. Cuyler and Gabi Shutt from FSU's Arts Administration.

The Fellows Society First Annual Spring Celebration Event

On April 16th, the **FSU Fellows Society** held their 1st annual Spring Celebration Event. This new event, held virtually this year due to COVID-19 restrictions, provided time to celebrate the achievements of graduating members of the Fellows Society. The event also served as a time to recognize those Fellows who served on the 2020-2021 Fellows Society Advisory Board. **The Fellows Society**



Advisory Board exists to provide members of the Society an opportunity to hold elected leadership positions and assist in producing collaborative, interdisciplinary, and service events throughout the academic year.

Fall 2020's Fellows Society President's Social, which typically takes place at the FSU President's House, was canceled because of COVID-19 restrictions. Therefore, this Celebration also served as a venue for to thank President & Mrs. Thrasher for their years of support and generosity. The annual group photo was taken with them via Zoom this year! A Kudoboard "Thank You and Happy Retirement" card, digitally signed by Society members, was also shared with President & Mrs. Thrasher. The event ended with a preview of the new Fellows Society Mentoring Program, planned to launch in 2021.

Three-Part Grants Workshop

The **Office of Postdoctoral Affairs** partnered with the **Office of Graduate Fellowships and Awards** and the **Office of Research** to host three interconnected workshops to assist postdoctoral scholars and graduate trainees with the preparation of extramural applications or independent research grants. Scholars and trainees who participated in all three sessions and submitted their proposals to an extramural agency were eligible to receive an intramural grant award for training-related expenses of their research project (\$750 graduate trainees, \$1,000 postdoctoral scholars). These funds were graciously contributed by the Office of Research.

Part I of the workshop was held March 19 & 22, 2021. Experienced faculty who have served on grant review panels presented the latest criteria and strategies for a number of different agencies in a variety of fields and disciplines including US Department of Agriculture, Women in Science L'Oreal, National Institutes of Health, National Science Foundation, American Heart Association, Brain &

Behavior Research Foundation, National Association for Education, and US Department of Education. After this, a Canvas page was deveoped to house resources associated with construction of a competitive proposal.

Part II of the workshop, held June 16 & 23, 2021, enabled postdocs and graduate students to work in peer writing groups to perfect their Specific Aims Page for their applications.

Finally, participants in *Part III*, held September 29 & October 6, 2021, engaged in a Mock Study Section with a panel of self-selected faculty who provided constructive advice regarding the full proposal, prior to submission to an extramural agency. Twenty-five postdoctoral scholars and graduate students at FSU participated in the full series and are enthusiastically working towards high caliber submissions in 2021. Fingers crossed!



OFFICE OF GRADUATE FELLOWSHIPS AND AWARDS (OGFA)

In addition to departmental and university awards, graduate students are eligible to apply for various highly competitive, state, national, and international funded fellowships, scholarships, and grants to support their work and research during their graduate school journey at FSU. OGFA facilitates FSU's graduate students during their nomination and application for awards by providing information through the lens of ongoing professional development, portfolio building, development of communication and writing skills, and engaging scholarly development from a holistic approach.

During the 2020-2021 academic year, graduate students received over three million dollars in nationally competitive fellowships and awards. This is a huge accomplishment and testament to the hard work and high level of scholarship and graduate education at Florida State University.

Building Community in Our New Normal

The global pandemic, COVID-19, shifted the way we connect but it did not stop us from building community. **Coffee and Conversation**, a virtual video series was birthed to provide graduate students a safe space to engage in discussion about life as a graduate student, ways of coping during these unprecedented times, and research and work in this new normal of remote living and learning. Since March 2021, we have interviewed more than 60 graduate students from all over campus.
